President's Message Ruth Hartman

Dear Congregation Shir Ami Members and Friends,

I have to admit that I'm usually glad to see December end. The "holiday season" can be difficult, and some years I find myself feeling resentful and just wanting it to be over. But this year I had a different experience. Somehow, I was able to use the rituals of the holiday season to feel more connected with what matters to me.

I was more touched than usual by the cards and notes (and even a few phone calls) I received from loved ones in distant places. I enjoyed sending gifts to my nieces and nephews and to the folks I work with all year. Two of my subcontractors managed to overcome my usual resistance and convince me that we should send gifts to our clients. It turned out to be really fun to send cookie boxes out into the world and receive surprised and pleased emails in return.

It was lovely to light the Hanukkah candles with Gary and our two daughters, and to bake Hanukkah butter cookies with the girls. It was great to have a bit of time off from work and school, to have the homework pressure lift and the phone ring a little less often. It was fun to stay up late knowing we could sleep in an extra hour in the morning.

One of the best parts was sharing a couple of holiday meals with my mother and stepfather. In my mother's kitchen in San Francisco on December 25, we lit candles, spoke the names of those no longer with us, and said a memorial "Oseh shalom." I felt deeply grateful to have my parents alive and to be able to be with them.

As December fades and the new secular year begins, I hope to carry that sense of gratitude and connection into 2007. Our tradition offers us Shabbat as a brilliant weekly chance to "check in" (as the teens say) with what matters most to us. The moments of quiet over the lighting of the candles, the silent reflection during the Amidah portion of the service, even the chance to greet friends and share stories after the service ends, these are all ritual moments that can help us remember who we want to be and how we want to live.

Our rabbinic interns and lay leaders work hard to make our Shabbat services meaningful for all of us. Sometime in 2007, we'll be receiving our copies of the new Reform siddur (prayerbook), Mishkan T'filah, which will offer us new ways to use Shabbat worship to achieve greater connection with ourselves, God, and one another.

So I wish you all a happy, healthy New Year filled with human connection, growth of the mind, care of the body, gratitude for the moment, and the chance to pursue that which matters most to you. And I look forward to seeing you at Shir Ami throughout the year.

Thanks to all who helped make the Chanukah party a wonderful event. Bekah's singing, kitchen helpers, staffers of stations, and participating children and parents all contributed to a great feeling in the building, and fun for all involved. Barbara Haber has generously contributed her Sufganiyot recipe for anyone who wants to try the donuts at home.

Sufganiyot 1 Package dry yeast 1/4 cup warm water (110-115 degrees, please use a thermometer) 1 egg, beaten 1 3/4 cups milk 1 stick butter 3/4 cup sugar 3 dashes salt dash of nutmeg dash of cinnamon grated rind of 1 lemon 5 1/2 cups flour oil for frying

1. Dissolve yeast in warm water in glass bowl. Set aside for 10 minutes.

2. After 10 minutes, add beaten egg to yeast and stir.

Set aside.

3. Scald milk in small pot (scalding is heating to almost boiling but not bubbling.) 4. Add butter to milk and remove from heat. Let butter melt.

5. When milk is lukewarm (not hot to the touch) add sugar, salt, spices and lemon rind.

6. Add egg and yeast mixture and stir.

7. Blend in flour 1 cup at a time. This can be done by hand or in a stand mixer. The dough will quickly overpower a hand mixer, so I wouldn't recommend it.

8. Set aside in a warm place to rise for two to three hours. Dough should double in size.

9. Punch dough down and begin to pinch off walnut sized pieces. They can be flattened or rolled into balls.

10. Heat oil in deep pot. Test by dropping one of the donuts in – oil should bubble around the dough.

11. Cook a few donuts at a time to preserve the oil temp.

12. Drain donuts on paper towel.

13. Poke holes for jelly or pudding. With finger.

Use zip lock bags for jelly or pudding.

14. Roll in powdered sugar after adding jelly.
