President's Message

Dear Congregation Shir Ami Members and Friends,

This year's Shir Ami annual membership meeting will be **Sunday, May 20 at 12:30**. The meeting will follow an end-of-the-school-year potluck lunch and party that will start at 11:30. All are invited to the party, of course, but I particularly want to encourage members to attend the membership meeting. We will be electing our 2007-2008 Board of Directors, and also discussing and voting on *an increase in membership dues* for the coming year.

In the past year, your Board and volunteers have worked hard to provide new programs to meet the needs of our community. These programs enrich our Jewish experience, but also add to our costs. For example:

- We added a pre-K Religious School program and expanded our Confirmation Class program. Our Religious School is funded almost entirely out of membership dues. We now have 35 children enrolled in our school.
- Our Education Committee voted to adopt the Union for Reform Judaism's CHAI curriculum to strengthen the Jewish education we offer our young people.
- We helped our youth experience the joy of Jewish camps by offering a \$150 campership per child (about 7-10 children per year take advantage of this assistance), and we paid assessments for eight teens participation in Midrasha.
- We installed a security alarm system in the building and instituted security measures at our High Holiday services.
- We engaged Rachel Brott as our new cantorial soloist for the coming High Holiday season.
- We performed deferred maintenance on our building, including foundation work, repaired termite damage, and replaced a rotted-out fence. The maintenance needs of our aging building are significant and ongoing.
- We subsidized the costs of our Tu B'Shevat Seder, Community Passover Seder, and other community events to help keep them accessible to our congregants.

Much like a weight-loss program, in which you must decrease calories or increase exercise to reach your goal, the Board has only two options: we can cut expenses or increase revenues.

Your Board takes our fiscal responsibilities very seriously. We have trimmed costs where we can. But most of our basic operating costs are rising, from airfares for our rabbinic interns, to insurance costs, to utilities, to kitchen supplies.

So we need to increase our income, which comes primarily from dues, donations, and fundraising events. But most people don't like fundraising. Your Board is stretched thin planning and running programs. We don't have the time or energy it would take to mount successful fundraising efforts. And you, the members, don't seem eager to deal with repeated solicitations or fundraising events throughout the year.

All this leads to the conclusion that a dues increase is the most equitable and effective way to continue to offer a rich variety of programs and services while keeping our building safe and habitable. So we are proposing an increase in dues for the 2007-2008 membership year to \$500 for single member units and \$1000 for family units (two or more adults, or one adult with children living in the home).

As always, a dues adjustment is available for anyone for whom our dues pose a financial hardship. We value every member, and we do not want dues to be an obstacle to your membership. The process is simple; all it takes is a confidential phone call to me.

Our bylaws require that 20% of our households be represented at the annual membership meeting on **Sunday, May 20 at 12:30** in order to approve the Board slate and vote on the dues proposal. Please send at least one adult from your household to the meeting. I look forward to seeing you there.

Midrasha News

Our own **Evelyn Carmack**, one of 19 happy seniors who will be celebrating the completion of 5 years in the East Bay Midrasha Network of classes and retreats at their *Siyum*, or Graduation Exercises on Tuesday, May 15, 2007 in the Sanctuary of Temple Sinai. Their Tuesday evening school, Bay Area Midrasha in Oakland, will celebrate the completion of 17 years of providing quality Jewish education to teens; the public is invited. The occasion will mark not only the farewell to the current Senior class of 19 accomplished young men and women, but also will include the acknowledgement of generous grants received this year from the following important funders of Midrasha programs:

- The Jewish Community Federation and Foundation of the Greater East Bay, which nurtures the renaissance and renewal of local Jewish life, and provides life-sustaining support for Jews in need—in the East Bay, in Israel, and around the world, made education its highest priority this year. It awarded both operating funds and financial assistance to students through its Fund for Jewish Education, Pre-School through College and its Permanent Community Endowment.
- The Legacy Heritage Foundation, through its extremely generous school development grants, has made Professional Development of Midrasha teachers a special field of endeavor for this year.
- Sinai Memorial Chapel, which provides funeral services throughout the Bay Area, annually grants subventions to a variety of Jewish community institutions. At Midrasha it helps fund the Sinai Memorial Chapel Classes in the Ritual Arts.

As all Midrasha programs in the East Bay enroll students in a vast array of activities without respect to synagogue affiliation, previous religious education, or ability to pay, these grants represent an important source of funding with which to expand the Midrasha community and encourage more in-depth experiences for all students.

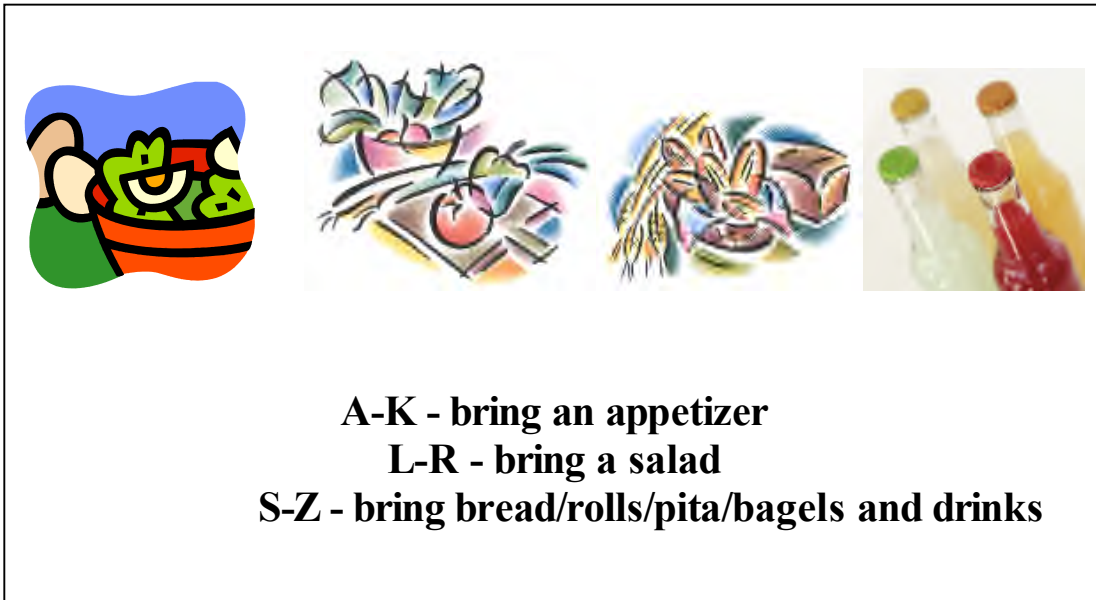
