Each year we get to experience some of the best new minds and spirits that the Hebrew Union College in Los Angeles has to offer. Each year we attach—and then must say goodbye.

In exchange, we have the opportunity to be part of the training process for these students, and to watch them grow into the role of rabbi. We get to see ourselves freshly each year through their eyes. They offer us their best, and we get to reach for the best in ourselves in return. It's an unusual arrangement, but it seems to work pretty well for us.

Rabbis' Corner Bekah Stern Carla Fenves

Dear Congregation Shir Ami Members and Friends,

It was less than 2 weeks ago that we concluded our Passover Seders with the words, *l'shanah ha'ba'ah bi'Yerushalayim*—next year in Jerusalem! And it was just a little over a half a year ago, on Erev Rosh Ha'Shanah, that I spoke to you about developing a new kind of love for Israel. I spoke of the kind of true, deep, steady love that allows each partner to see the other's flaws and gifts, and to work together to be the best they each can be. I spoke about *ahavat tzion*, an old idea, meaning *a love of Zion*, this same eyes-wide-open kind of love. Zion, Israel, is at the center of our Jewish focus throughout the year, on every annual holiday, on every Shabbat, during every prayer service.

But now, this month, Israel is on our minds perhaps more than at any other time of the year. On May 7th Jews around the world will mark Yom Ha'Zikaron—a day of memory for Israel's fallen soldiers. And the next day, May 8th, we will celebrate Yom Ha'atzmaut—the Day of Independence, the day that marks the 60th anniversary of the birth of the modern State of Israel. It is an emotional one-two-punch. Our Israeli brothers and sisters have sacrificed, and continue to sacrifice much to ensure that there will always be a safe place for Jews to live freely as Jews. The timing of these two holidays, falling as they do less than a week after Holocaust Remembrance Day (Yom Ha'Shoah), reminds us that Jews have not always had such an accessible refuge. Many times in the last half-century has the question been asked, "Would the six million Jews of Europe have been spared if the State of Israel had existed during World War II?"

But I am not only a survivalist. I do not only engage with the State of Israel because I want it to be a refuge should America become hostile to Jews in my lifetime or in the lifetime of my children or of my children's children. I learn about Israel, and work on behalf of Israel, and feel a love for Israel because it enriches my Judaism. We are a people with two major centers in the modern world—one is here in the US, but the other is in the East, in Zion. I have learned in the State of Israel that Judaism can be a guiding principle even in the most secular areas of my life. It is in fact possible to be Jewish in a taxi, in the supermarket, and at the post office. Israel inspires me to try to find more Jewish time in my secular American life. And this pursuit leads me to a place of greater connectedness with our past, with my spiritual center, and with the Divine.

I cannot predict what effect a deepened relationship, your own version of *Ahavat Tzion*, will have on you and on your Jewish journey. I can only encourage you to learn as much as you can, to meet and talk with Israelis—either in the US or in Israel—as often as you can, and, as always, to examine your assumptions as carefully as you can. As Theodore Herzl wrote, "If you want it, it is no legend: to be a free people in our land of Zion and Jerusalem." Only by engaging deeply with Israel can it truly become the Israel of legend.

Since this will be my final bulletin article, I want to take a sentence or two to thank you, the Shir Ami community, for all that you have given me in the last two years. I have learned so much from you about what it means to be a rabbi. Thank you for opening your homes and yourselves, and for allowing me to be a part of your lives. It has been my honor. I very much hope to be able to say goodbye to you in person during my last visit May 9-11. ~ Rebekah

He was recently awarded the "Excellence in Special Education" award by the Mid Alameda County SELPA. This is a group of school districts including Castro Valley, Hayward, San Leandro and San Lorenzo. Todd is interested in issues of democracy, justice, education and critical thinking. Todd also likes to translate Chinese, and has recently been working on Tang Dynasty Poetry from the 700's. To quote Todd's thoughts about Shir Ami, "I think we have been blessed with a long series of wonderful Rabbis and a community that helps us be better people." We are lucky to have such a respected and thoughtful educator teaching in our school.
