Recently, I heard a woman talk about growing up Afghani in an American school system. The schools she attended were tolerant of her need to be absent periodically, but had no insights into her culture's celebrations. The story sounded familiar. Most of my schooling was in California, where the words Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur were equally foreign. In schools such as this woman and I experienced, being different meant simply explaining or just avoiding the topic as we chose. This year, in Mississippi, being different meant one young woman could not take her date to their prom. In Hayward, youth have had a safe place to dance, talk, gather resources, play games, eat, and enjoy a great prom for about 16 years.
