PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Shir Ami Members and Friends:

Outreach to new members is very important to our future as a community and one of my top priorities as your President. So I'm pleased to tell you about a creative new membership outreach initiative that your Board approved in September. Starting immediately, we will be reducing dues for all new members for their first two years of membership.

As you know, our policy has always been that money should not be a barrier to membership and that we would not turn away anyone who could not afford full dues. But in this economic environment, we have been finding that the financial commitment of membership is a barrier for more and more of the prospective members we talk with. So in order to allow prospective members to experience Shir Ami firsthand and understand the value of Shir Ami membership, we decided to try out a dues structure that brings in new people to Shir Ami at a reduced rate and works up to full dues and fees by the beginning of the third year of membership. It's our hope that by the end of two years, these members will feel connected and engaged and ready to assume their full part in supporting the community.

Here is how the new dues structure works:

Single membership: 1st year - \$200, 2nd year - \$400, 3rd year – full current dues plus new member building fee

Family membership: 1st year - \$300, 2nd year - \$600, 3rd year – full current dues plus cost of Hebrew school (if applicable) and new member building fee

As always, if these dues levels present a serious financial hardship for a prospective member, they can talk to me confidentially about a dues adjustment.

I wanted to share this with you for a couple of reasons. First, I hope you will talk about Shir Ami with your Jewish friends and neighbors and invite them to attend services, adult ed classes, and Religious School with you and your family. I hope the new member dues structure may make Shir Ami more accessible to people you know who may be interested but unsure about the financial commitment.

Second, this is an experiment, and your Board needs your involvement to implement the program and your feedback to evaluate its success. So if you have any questions or concerns about this new member dues structure—or any other aspect of our financial operations—please contact me.

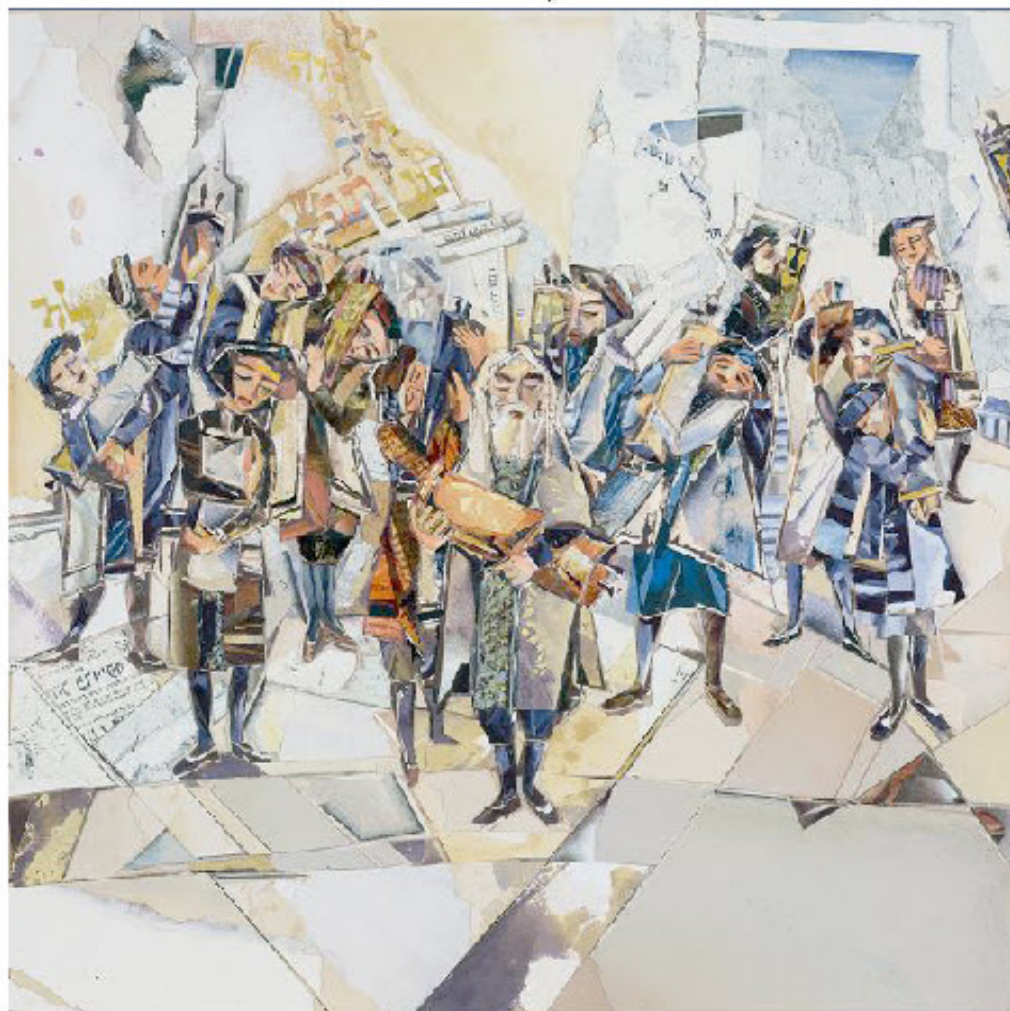

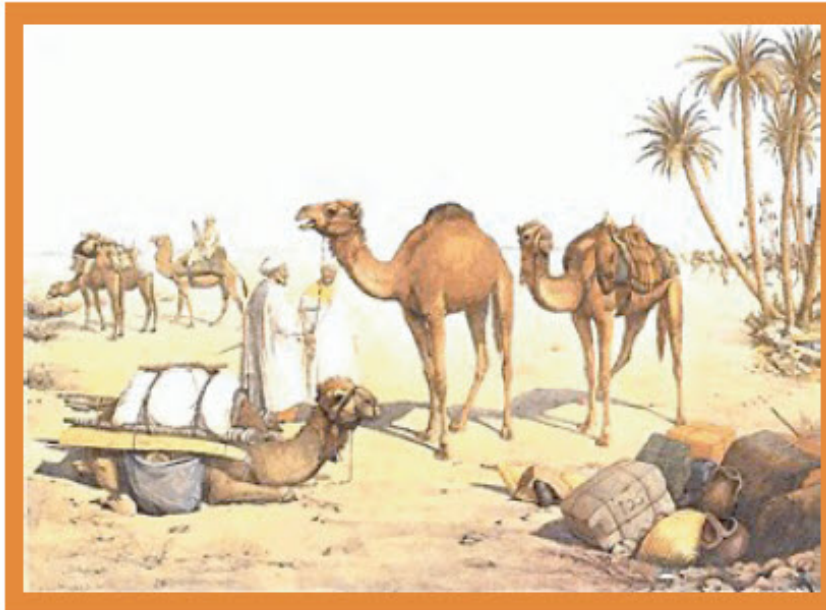

BLUEBERRY CAKE from Milton Palmer
(from a German cookbook)

Crust

Flour 200gm(about 1 1/2cup)
Butter 100gm(3/4 stick)
Sugar 5 T
Egg 1

Mix flour, butter and sugar.

Add egg and knead until it comes together.

Form ball, wrap in foil or parchment paper.

Let rest in refrig for two hours.

Roll out and line bottom and sides of spring-
form pan.

Filling:

Blueberries (I used frozen, thawed) 500 gm(1lb,1 oz)

Eggs separated, 3

Sugar 100gm(3.5oz)

Peeled ground almonds* 125 gm(4.5oz)

* Ground almonds avail at Trader Joe's

- In meantime, separate egg yolks and whites.
- Beat egg yolks with half of sugar.
- Mix in almonds·
- Mix in blueberries.
- Beat egg whites with balance of sugar until it forms soft peaks.
- Gently fold egg white mixture into the blue berry mixture.
- Pour into crust.
- Place in a pre-heated 190°c(375 deg.F) oven.
- Bake for about 40 min.
