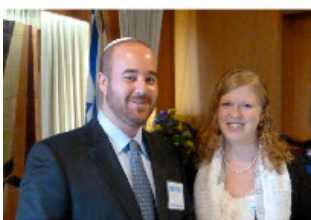

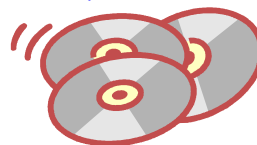

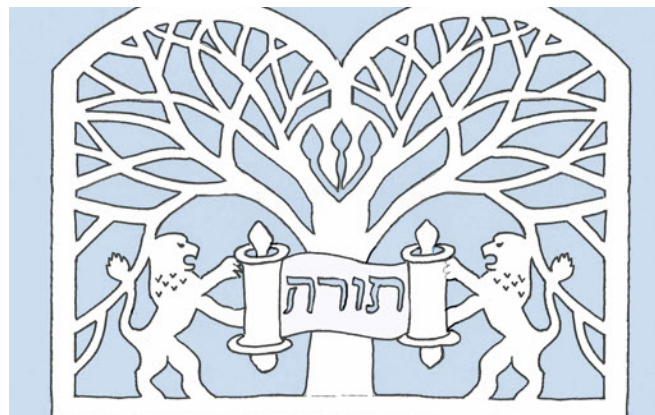

SCHOOL NOTES

The Shir Sholom Religious and Hebrew School has continued with great success. Children spend Sundays studying, playing, singing, creating, and, of course, eating together. With the guidance of a fabulous teaching staff and Rabbis Andrew, Lara, and Manhoff, our students have delved deeper and deeper into the concept of prayer. October classes centered around the questions, “Why do I pray?” and “Who do I pray to?” The range of activity and thought throughout the building has been phenomenal to observe.

Let me share just some of the examples of what has been going on around the school this month. The preschool/kindergarten class mimicked our forefather, Abraham, by making idols and then destroying them, affirming their beliefs in one God. The third and fourth graders were “forced” to learn what resting meant to study the meaning of Shabbat. The debate that came about whether or not it was necessary afterwards was fascinating. And our oldest students worked with Adonai’s name, as presented in the Torah, a complex and mature task.

Tuesday Hebrew School perhaps brings the clearest moments of academic growth. Kita Alef (the beginner class) can be heard outside of its room shouting out the letters and vowels they have mastered since September. Kita Bet (the beginning/intermediate class) is often found racing to the board to show how well they recognize fully formed words. Kita Gimmel (the intermediate class) can be found outside playing prayer tag, as they master more and more of each piece of t’fillah. And Kita Daled (our advanced students) is often deep in discussion regarding the meaning of prayer, Judaism, and life. The maturity in the learning that continues on Tuesdays is sometimes mind-boggling.

As October comes to a close, the next stage of the Shir Sholom School is approaching. We will head to Temple Beth Sholom for the next quarter of the school year for both Sunday and Tuesday classes from October 31st until January 23rd. This is an exciting opportunity for the school, and we are all looking forward to seeing what the next quarter will provide for our students.

“ROSE’S RAMBLINGS”

New Member Profile: Barbara-Ann Lewis.

Professor, Grandmother, Violin Maker: all these describe the versatile Barbara-Ann Lewis.

Barbara-Ann was born and grew up in the Philippines. She was seven years old when the Japanese occupied the country; her wartime experiences are described in a children’s book that she wrote especially for her grandchildren in order for them to learn of their family’s history.

After graduating college in the Philippines she worked for several years in soil chemistry. In her late twenties she decided that she needed further studies and moved to California to attend UC Berkeley, where she was awarded a PhD in soil science. She met her husband, Roy, at the university, and when they completed their studies, they left for Illinois to take teaching positions: he in Physics at the University of Chicago and she in environmental engineering and science at Northwestern University. After more than 25 years of research and teaching, they retired and returned to California to be with their family consisting of three children, their spouses, and six grandchildren ranging in age from 4 to 18.

To prepare for her retirement, Barbara-Ann had an unusual interest. She spent three years attending the Chicago School of Violin Making and is now creating violins and violas using methods of the old Italian masters. She hopes to sell these in the near future. She and Roy live in Castro Valley with their dog, Nellie. We’re happy to see Barbara-Ann at services and at Shir Ami events. Welcome!

Remember, it was not until 1920 that women were granted the right to vote. And not until the 1960's that regulations that prevented people of color from voting were overturned. People were jailed for picketing the White House, carrying signs asking for their right to vote. Nov. 14, 1917, prison guards wielding clubs and their warden's blessing went on a rampage against the 33 women convicted of 'obstructing sidewalk traffic' at the Occoquan Workhouse in Virginia. So, consider, some people won't vote this year because 'we're very busy', because we think our vote doesn't matter anyway, or because it's raining. Have we forgotten what it took to ensure our right to vote? Do we not realize that there are lots of opportunities to be educated voters?
