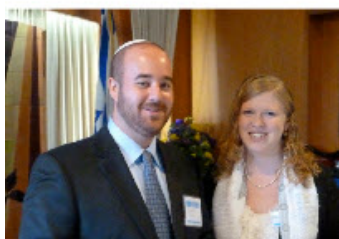
Shalom! In this week's Torah portion, Miketz, found in Genesis 41:1-44:17, we read of Pharaoh's four dreams, and of Joseph's interpretation of the dreams and what they hold to be true. Joseph interprets the first two of Pharaoh's dreams to mean there will be seven years of bounty and great abundance in the land, and the last two dreams to mean that there will then follow seven years of severe famine. In Parashat Miketz, Genesis 41:32, it states the following of the dreams: "As for Pharaoh having had the same dream twice, it means that the matter has been determined by God, and that God will soon carry it out." Have you ever had a dream that has somewhat predicted the future, or has come true at some point in your life? And if what it says in the Torah is true, what does it mean if we have the same dream twice?

We would like to push you to dream, and to use your dreams to help you to make good choices in your life. If our dreams predict the future, then can't we use our dreams as a preview, and don't we therefore have some way to control our destiny?

We look forward to exploring a variety of different ideas, stories, and characters in our text from whom we can learn during the upcoming months together. Please read the following information carefully, and we look forward to seeing you at whatever opportunities you choose to attend with us.

SCHOOL NOTES

The month of December can be a challenging and confusing time for Jewish children. The onslaught of commercialized Christmas in American society can be overwhelming. Then, often with the best of intentions, some sort of token representation of Chanukka is added to store windows; television commercials; and, all too often, our public schools. The misidentification of Chanukka as a parallel to Christmas is a massive issue to tackle but tackle it we must.

This is one of those times when our role as Jewish adults and educators is extremely important and clear. We need to be able to remind our children of what is the real story and meaning of Chanukah. It is our job to teach beyond false miracles and presents. Perhaps more importantly, we must ingrain in our children a pride in their Judaism that would please the Maccabees themselves. Our children should know our history, know why we celebrate the way we do,

and be able to articulate their feelings about their faith both privately and publically.

At the Shir Sholom Religious School we work on all of this all year long, not just in December. This year we have specifically guided our lessons to help the students learn where prayer and praying fall into this understanding and development. We will spend a morning learning about Chanukah: the history, the celebration, the prayers. Then we will continue to expand the students' pride in their Judaism in general, the truly significant lesson from the Chanukah story.

There was a wonderful spread of tasty delights including hearty soups and salads, fruits and sweets.



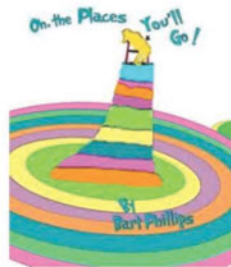

New Member Profile

Last month we launched a column highlighting a new member, **Barbara-Ann Lewis**. This month we will introduce you to two more new members, **Marlene Lamnin** and **Gail Steele**.

Marlene Lamnin

If you thought computer dating was relatively new, **Marlene Lamnin** can tell you otherwise. She is a semi-retired pharmacist, born and raised in Philadelphia. In 1966 through a matchmaking program on a very early vintage computer, she met and married Joseph Lamnin. They moved to Houston, Texas where their daughter Sara was born. After several years they moved again to Southern California. Marlene became active in a large Conservative Synagogue in Newhall and served as Sisterhood President. When Sara started college at SF State, Marlene and Joseph followed her, and made their way north to the Bay Area. Marlene taught pharmacology and became Program director at Western Career College in San Leandro. She has just retired from that position, but is still employed part-time as a staff pharmacist at San Leandro Hospital. She’s also teaching at Castro Valley Adult School, preparing nurses for their Board exams.

Marlene finds it special that both she and Sara met their respective husbands via matchmaking computer: Sara on “J”Date in 2004 and Marlene more than four decades earlier on a huge ‘60s style mainframe! At last year’s Rosh Chodesh retreat, our multi-talented Marlene single handedly wrote, directed and produced a most successful Purim play. She thinks Shir Ami is “cool” and loves the relaxed and friendly feeling in the congregation. She is especially thrilled to see our young people taking part in services. In her words, “it touches my heart.”

Gail Steele

A look at **Gail Steele**’s web site reveals a long history of community involvement and political activism. Here are but a few highlights of her career in local government and politics:

For the past 18 years, Gail has been Alameda County Supervisor, Second District. Among many other involvements, she has also served as chair of the following committees: Alameda County Mental Health Advisory Board; Alameda County Children’s Memorial Grove Program; Eden Youth & Family Center Board of Directors; Children’s Advocacy

Gail’s early background: until the age of fifteen, Gail lived in the country near Guerneville, where her parents created and ran Pond Farm, an art school. This was in the 1940s and early 1950s; many of the teachers at the school were Jewish refugees who had escaped Nazi Germany. Gail’s mother Jane came from a large, prominent German Jewish family that had settled in San Francisco in the 1850s.

When her mother died, Gail lived with her grandmother in San Francisco, and spent the last year of high school at Lowell High School. Gail then attended UC Berkeley and graduated with a degree in sociology, married Jack Steele in 1959, and had four children.

In 1968 Jack received a Fullbright teaching exchange position, and the young family relished the opportunity to live in Vienna for two years. According to Gail, as a result of what she felt was the anti-Semitic atmosphere of Vienna, she became more identified with Judaism. When Jack and Gail returned to the U.S. they settled in Hayward and joined Temple Beth Shalom, where all four of their children celebrated their B’nai Mitzvah and Confirmation. Meanwhile her family has grown to four grandchildren, two step grandchildren, and three step great-grandchildren.

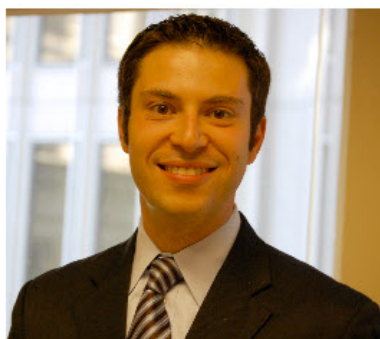

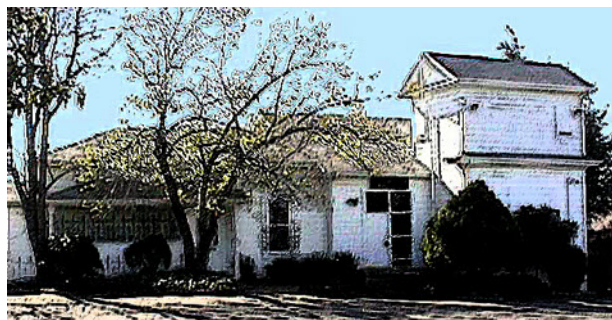
