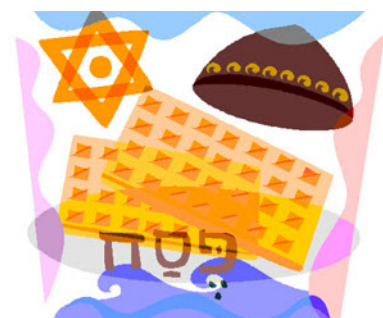

Dear Shir Ami Members and Friends:

It seems to me that this year is just flying by faster than previous years! The Shir Ami Board is working on next year's budget and planning for our Community Annual Meeting on Sunday, May 22. Our Community Seder planning is underway and I am excited about some changes the Passover Committee and Religious Committee are making for this year.

This year the Rev. Dr. Arlene Nehring of Eden United Church of Christ generously invited us to hold our Community Seder in their lovely and spacious Social Hall. Their facilities will make it so much easier for our food committee and servers! This is a great opportunity to strengthen the friendship between Shir Ami and Eden UCC that we've been building over the past several years. The hall is spacious enough that we are able to invite members of Rev. Arlene's community to join us for the Seder. 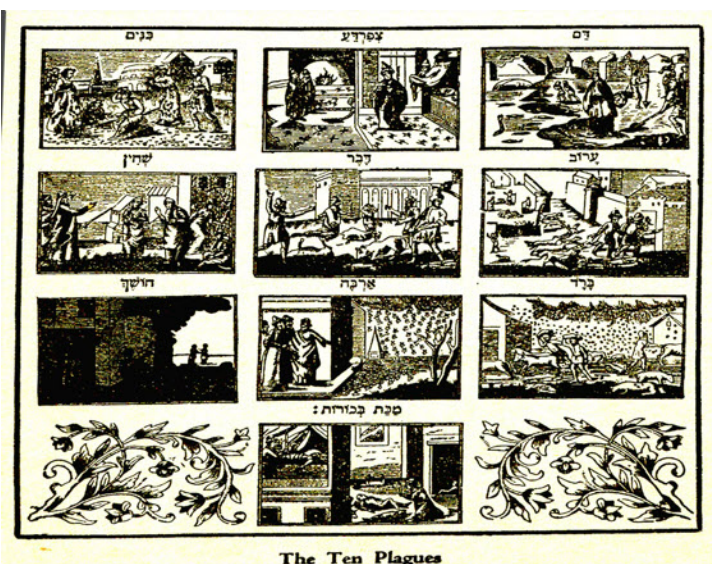

Also, thank you to Rose Firestone who gave us her online Haggadah to use as the basis for our new Haggadah.

Lastly, I am thrilled to tell you that Ricki Weintraub will be back with us this year to lead the Passover service and the singing! You definitely will not want to miss the Seder this year! You should have received an Evite in your email, and there is a flier in this month's bulletin with the details. Reservations and a check written to Congregation Shir Ami are required by April 13 to guarantee you a seat. I am looking forward to seeing you there!

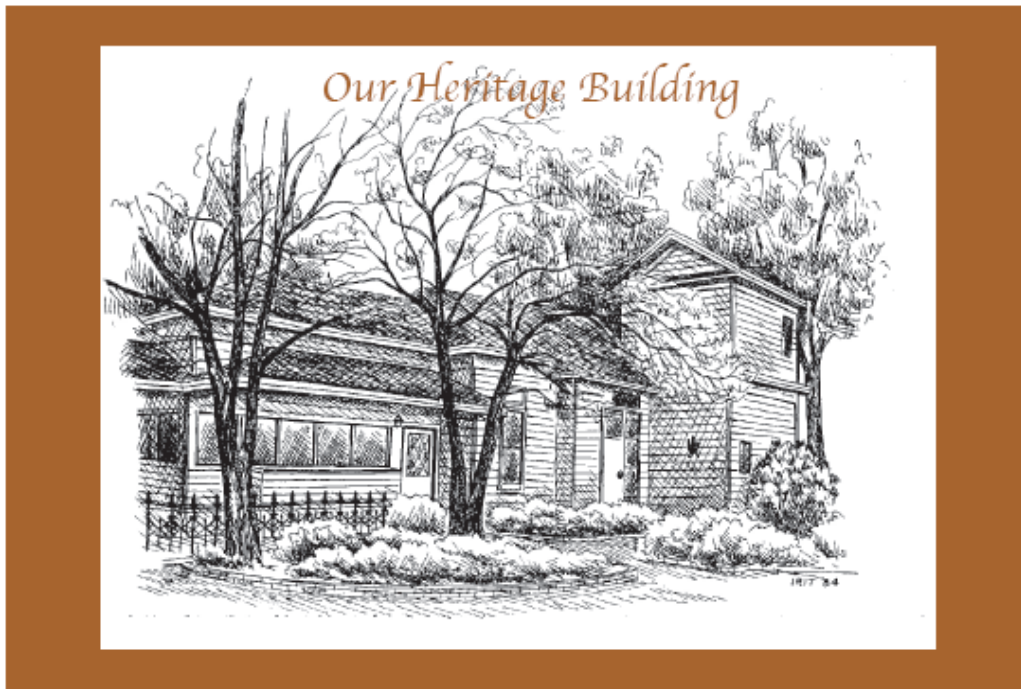
Mark your calendars now and watch for information alerting you to the opening of online registration, which will begin soon.

Paresha *acharei mot* - Events *after the death* of Aaron's sons

The two sons of Aaron died by fire (Paresah Shemini, for offering unapproved fire before G-d). G-d ruled against anybody, except Aaron, going into the special chamber of the Mishkan, called the Holy of Holies. Aaron was permitted entry only once a year, on Yom Kippur, the holiest day of the year. And also on Yom Kippur, two goats were selected by lottery. One goat was offered to G-d and the second one was sent to the wilderness bearing the sins of the Israelites.

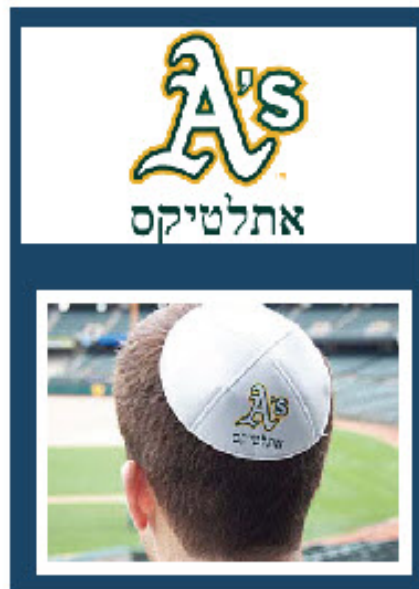

Hi,

*I'd be happy to write something, although it's a bit
short notice. What would you like to know? I live with
a wonderful host family with 4 kids. The youngest is 2
and she's really cute. She breaks everything but I love
her. It's been a little hard adjusting to being here but
now I'm getting the hang of it. Amman is built on lots
of hills and all the buildings are square and either
painted tan and or finished with limestone. The down-
town is a classic Middle Eastern city market with spic-
es and fruit mixed with souvenir shops and illegal
DVDs for 1 JD (that's Jordanian Dinar, 1.4 US Dol-
lars). I've traveled a little bit, not much yet, and seen
some great ruins from a lot of different time periods. I
also saw the river that Jacob crossed after he wrestled
with the angel and got the name Israel, which was
hard to wrap my mind around. My classes are good
and my classroom Arabic has improved a lot although
I still have trouble on the street. Leah*

said the British. The teacher got a skeptical look on
her face and said "We don't call the British a civiliza-
