Dear Shir Ami Members and Friends:





May Rosh Chodesh

There was a big turnout for our last Rosh Chodesh when we brought in the month of Iyar at the home of Rose Firestone. The month of Iyar contains the holiday of Lag B' Omer so we honored several rituals that reflected that holiday. We read about the month and the meaning of Lag B' Omer to get an understanding of the background and the rituals. We had a meal with roasted potatoes, a traditional dish in Israel during Lag B' Omer. We picked our toppings for the potatoes from chili, cheese, green onions, and sour cream.

Another tradition during Lag B' Omer is to have bon fires. We were able to have our own bon fire in the lovely fire pit in Rose's backyard. We roasted marshmallows and made S'mores. During Lag B' Omer, marriages, celebrations, and hair cutting is permit-



ted, which are not allowed during the entire Omer from Passover to Shauvouts. We focused on our hair– bringing pictures of ourselves with a different style or cut. 
