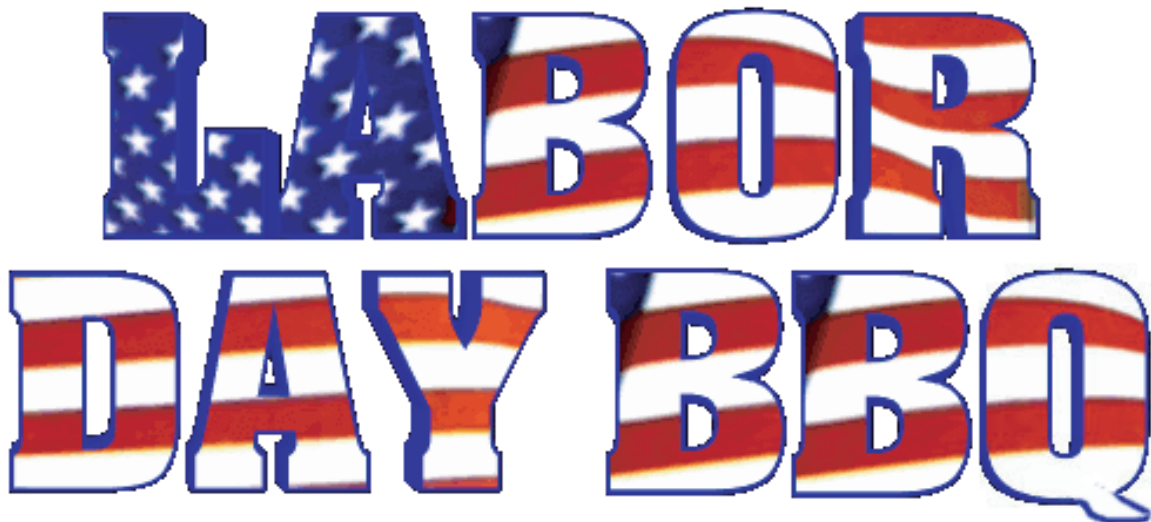

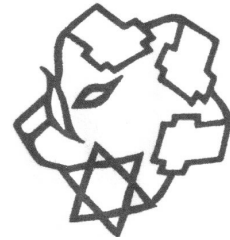

Food Pantry



Where there is no bread, there is no Torah. – *Pirkei Avot 3:17*

HUNGRY: A BASIC WORD

Two and a half hours each day, four days each week, fifty-two weeks each year, South Hayward Parish's (SHP) Food Pantry provides food to people who are hungry. Tuesday through Friday, folk line up to receive whatever is available that day. Regardless of the weather or the time of year, they come. Elder women come with their carts, moms walk in, hugged by shy children, embarrassed men who have been out of work for months stand patiently, and couples who live in their cars pick out the food that they can eat without refrigeration or heat. Each one is greeted with respect and a family atmosphere has evolved over time. Younger members assist those who are older. On a good day, there is fresh fruit, or potatoes and onions, or lettuce, or juice, or oatmeal and tea. And on REALLY good days... chicken! There is always rice and beans, tuna fish and canned vegetables and bread. On some days, volunteers prepare treats or share recipes to use the foods available, which may be unknown to those on the line. Homemade Russian soup is served alongside pan-fried rice noodles. Staff and volunteers have learned to recognize "Thank You!" in many languages, such as English, Tagalog, Spanish, Farsi, Cantonese, Mandarin and Korean.

Since 1964, SHP has been engaging people of faith in the endeavor and partnership of building and maintaining a just and nurturing community. The Parish actively advocates for the rights and dignity of all people, regardless of sexual orientation, religion, ethnicity, race, or geographic origin. SHP is a non-profit organization whose members include seven different congregations in the Hayward-Castro Valley area. Shir Ami has been a member congregation since 2007 and our own Daryl Berman is President of the Board of Directors. This year, Shir Shalom students and teachers sang in SHP's annual Martin Luther King Rally and Peace March.

SHP runs two programs, each with a part-time staff member. The Food Pantry described above was one of the first programs of the organization and is now one of the largest pantries in our area. The Hayward Community Action Network is the newest program and will be described in next month's newsletter. South Hayward Parish's Food Pantry serves an average of 1,390 individuals each month (12,546 meals). Participants receive enough food for three to four days, a list of other pantries they can try, and referrals to other services to help them move from crisis to stability. SHP also makes broader efforts to address the nutritional needs of the community as well as the root causes of hunger through collaborations with local government and non-profit agencies.

Come learn more about this important non-profit organization and how you can help our fellow residents in need.

Dr. Abuelaish has worked as an OB/Gyn doctor in both Gazan and Israeli hospitals as well as at menial jobs before he became a doctor. His feet in both worlds, he travels back and forth across the border and explains what that is like. He has been in other war-torn countries and compares that to life in Gaza. Three of Dr. Abuelaish's daughters and one niece were killed during the month-long Israeli bombing of Gaza that began in Dec. 2008. He has written a powerful, personal, and compelling story of life on the other side of the occupation and will prompt a great discussion.

Havdallah and Mexican Movie Night

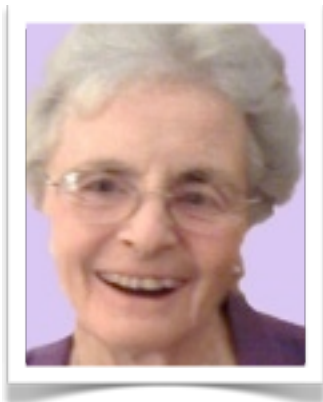
Sat., August 20, 8 pm

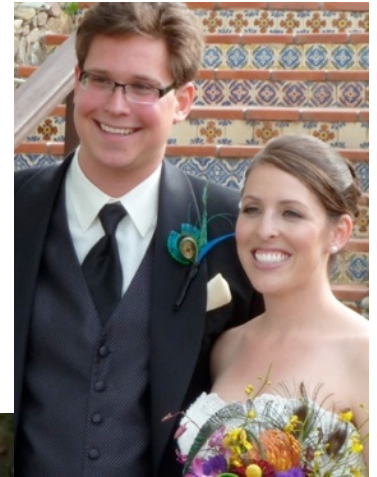
MORE SUMMER DOINGS
