President's Message

Dear Shir Ami Members and Friends:

In my column last month I mentioned that your board would be discussing communications and the scheduling of events, two topics that originated from the May Community Meeting. The goal was to identify the issues we have around communication, scheduling and member participation, etc. We had a great discussion that will be continued in our board meeting this month. A point raised about member participation that I want to share is that members may not volunteer for things because they either don't know about an activity or they do not know what that activity entails. We all agreed that the more a member gets involved with the temple activities, the more connected the member feels and the more value they get from their membership. This to me was a really important statement especially now as we start into a new year. There will be a new calendar of events, requests for members to sign up to host Rabbinic interns, provide Shabbat onegs, etc. I committed to the board that I would address what some of these activities entail here in this column.

This month I will address **Hosting a Rabbinic**Intern. As you know we have two Rabbinic Interns that come to Shir Ami from the Hebrew Union College in L.A. This year we welcome back Lara Pullan Regev and Andrew Terkel. Each weekend a host family will provide transportation to and from the Oakland Airport on Friday afternoons and Sunday afternoons and to and from their hotel and Shir Ami (or Temple Beth Shalom on some Sundays). The host family provides meals during the weekend – either hosting in their home or taking the intern out for a meal. I will admit that at first I was very hesitant on hosting. I was worried that I wouldn't know what to talk about, what to do for meals and what exactly it all entailed.

What prompted me to sign up for the first time was that I really liked one of the returning interns and felt comfortable with her. Bruce, Lexi and I really got to know the intern on a more personal level and actually formed a relationship that lasted beyond her term at Shir Ami. Now I look forward to hosting the interns. Many times host members invite other Shir Ami members to join them for dinner, which is a lot of fun. I find that also helps me break the ice with a new intern that we're hosting for the first time. Members have been hosting even when they can't provide transportation due to their work hours or for

whatever reason – they rent a car for the intern for the weekend.

I encourage you to sign up to host an intern this year – especially if you never have done this mitzvah. During the Labor Day BBQ and at the High Holy day services, David Schulberg will be asking members to sign up for a

Shir Ami Rabbinic Intern Hosting Responsibilities

Friday

- Pick intern up from airport and take him/her to the Quality Inn (formerly the Holiday Inn Express) 2532 Castro Valley Blvd., CV.
- Provide a Shabbat dinner (either at your home, at a restaurant or pot luck if one is scheduled)
- Bring intern to Shir Ami for Friday night Services [arrive at least 15 minutes before service time]
- Attend services. Optional: light and bless Shabbat candles at start of service.
- Drive intern to hotel after services

Saturday – subject to discussion depending on intern's needs

- Provide transportation if needed to Shir Ami Saturday morning (sometimes there is B'nai mitzvah tutoring)
- Provide lunch
- Provide transportation for adult education (could be late afternoon or evening)
- Provide dinner and transportation back to the hotel

Sunday

- Provide transportation to Shir Shalom School (either at Shir Ami or Temple Beth Sholom) by 9:15 am.
- Provide transportation to the airport after Sunday School (pick up intern at 12:00 pm)

Homeless, not Hopeless

HOMELESS, not Hopeless

(This article is a follow up to last month's profile on South Hayward Parish)

With a Bachelors degree in Business Administration and some bumps in his life journey, Sam is now a senior citizen who cannot get a job at Wal-Mart because he's 'over qualified'. He is not qualified to receive aid or services because he's 'too young' and not 'sick enough'. Sam has come to peace with sleeping on the streets every night. He is grateful for the Community Action Network that treats him with dignity and provides him the opportunity to give something back to the community in which he lives, working eight hours a day, two days a week.

Connie was pulled out of school after the 8th grade to work. At 56, she, like Sam, has had few prospects in the last few years, but has joined South Hayward Parish's Community Action Network (CAN). She and Sam are two of the jewelry makers in CAN's Homeless Angels Project. Jewelry making, "gives me a reason to get up in the morning," says Connie. "It gives me hope."

The newest program of the non-profit, South Hayward Parish, Hayward CAN was founded in 2007 to bring individuals who are homeless or at risk for homelessness together with members of the faith, business, and social and government service communities to develop sustainable solutions to end homelessness in Hayward. Hayward CAN has helped 30 people move into housing, school, and/or jobs and over 100 to connect to the services and opportunities required for self-sufficiency. CAN is also working with City and Business services to end panhandling in the area. Members of Hayward CAN have lived in the Hayward-Castro Valley area for an average of 33 years and 40% are lifelong residents. Typically, members are single men or couples without children, with an average age of 45 years. Most have worked in office, food service, and/or general labor industries. Many have made jewelry in the past.

When asked for solutions to hunger, homelessness, and community violence in the Hayward Area, community members of all ages and backgrounds answered, Jobs! Thus the Homeless Angels Jewelry Making project was born. Small beaded angel charms along with bracelets, necklaces, rings, and more are made by women and men living on the street. A portion of the proceeds from the jewelry are given to the CAN artists, with the balance of the funds reinvested directly into the training program. In addition to jewelry making techniques, the program helps people to practice organizational skills, follow through, and personal responsibility.

Come see the jewelry and learn more about CAN, South Hayward Parish, and how you can help our fellow residents in need.
