HISTORY OF CONGREGATION SHIR AMI (Part 1)

In last month's September Bulletin we wrote about the history of our two Torahs. This month we've received requests for the story of our Shir Ami building.

On a June day in 1965 Rose Levine, while exploring her new neighborhood around Redwood Road- the Levine

family had just moved into their new home a few blocks away- she spotted a sign outside 4529 Malabar Avenue, that read "FOR SALE". From the front, she could see a charming Victorian house and an expanse of grass with a huge tree growing on one side of the lawn; and in the back, a pink flagstonetiled patio was visible. Rose lost no time calling the Synagogue Search Committee to view the property. Among them were Leon Meyer, Rolf Weinberg, and Hillie Levine.

That same year our predecessor, the Jewish Community Association of Southern Alameda County, had voted to disband and to become a



congregation; our task now was to keep an eye out for a suitable building for a synagogue.

The committee made inquiries. The 1870's house originally belonged to a sea-faring man who spent his time in the loft, peering out a window with a spy glass,



looking out at the bay. This gave the house its name: "Pilot's Knob." After about three other owners, it was now the home of an elderly mother, her son and his partner. The rooms were lavishly furnished with antiques. In two of the rooms there were large mahogany consoles fitted with music boxes. A beautiful crystal chandelier hung from the ceiling. The back garden had a variety of fruit trees, such as apricot, olive, and an enormous pepper tree. And to top it off, three magnificent peacocks walked around the grounds.

The next few months were spent inspecting every corner of the building to convert it for use as a school, a synagogue and a community center. That summer, willing members spent full days volunteering their skills as movers, carpenters, electricians, and interior decorators. With the help of



Jerry Becker, who was in construction, Henry Ball, Hi Wolch, Charles Keegan, Hillie Levine, and others, it started to take shape. The story is told that one time a member of another synagogue came in to observe the process and to "kibbitz." Hillie and Hi were working. The walls were not yet affixed to the studs. The ceiling was unfinished and the floor tiles were only partially affixed to the underflooring. It was only two weeks to Rosh Hashanah. The curious visitor said cynically, "You'll never get this building put back together in time." Why, he was asked "because Jews are not skilled in such work!"

So did we get the job done? The goal was to complete the task by Rosh Hashanah, when we were scheduled to have our first service in the new building. The answer to that question, as well as to the part that the women played, will appear in the next issue of the Community Page..
