President's Message

President's Message for August 2012 Bulletin

Shalom Shir Ami,

I hope you are all enjoying your summer. For many, the summer months are a time for travel, and Sara and I are no exception. In early July we ventured to Russia. Among the sites we visited was the Grand Choral Synagogue in St. Petersburg. It's fascinating to me how this temple is simultaneously both majestic, compared with many American synagogues, and understated, compared to Russian churches elsewhere in the city. This reflects my own view of Judaism; its practice can be expressed in multiple forms that fit one's personal goals and perspective.

In addition to adventure, this summer has also brought our Congregation loss and renewed inspiration. Two from Shir Ami's family passed away in recent weeks: Frances Johnson and Rose Levine. While I didn't know Frances, many have spoken about her valued friendship and committed involvement in Shir Ami. I did have the pleasure of knowing Rose Levine. What always impressed me about Rose was her capacity for volunteerism. Among her many commitments was her role as a docent of the Magnes Collection of Jewish Art and Life, in Berkeley. Rose was the first member of Shir Ami I met, when she happily gave my parents a grand tour of the museum. Rose's willingness to help was seen time and again at Shir Ami, even through the beginning of this year. As Editor of the Community Page in our monthly Bulletin, Rose interviewed new Shir Ami members as a concerted

effort to help them feel more a part of the Shir Ami family, and for that family to get to know them. Rose's ability to give her time and attention to others has inspired how I conduct myself as a Shir Ami member and officer. I would ask you to reflect on this lesson and think about how you can use your time and attention to help both the Congregation and yourself. One of those ways may be to contribute to one of our Standing Committees. Three of them, Communications, Membership Outreach and Membership Lifecycle, reflect my priorities for the coming year.

The Communications Committee (led by Rose Firestone and Harriet Skelly) will be working together to improve the look, feel and content of our website, and to ensure that Shir Ami members are receiving all the pertinent information due to them. Membership Outreach (led by Bonnie Frey and Barbara Heimowitz) will be brainstorming new ways to reach out to unaffiliated Jews in the surrounding area to let them know all we have to offer. Finally, Membership Lifecycle (led by Jan Dombrower) will focus on making sure that Congregation membership is a positive and life-affirming experience for everyone.

Please consider joining one of these Committees. Help is needed to sustain and improve Shir Ami, and work, like grief and loss, is halved when it's shared.




ways and I always admired her for her ability to write fun plays for our retreats. She helped me lead my first services for Shir Ami. I loved Rose very much. ~ Harriet
