Elul is a month of reflection and repentance as we prepare for the upcoming High Holy Days. We gathered at Shir Ami as we began the process of repentance.

We reviewed the "Jewels of Elul", online writings on the Month of Elul, and we wrote in our own "Elul diaries" as we explored the concepts of

- 1. Stopping a sin
- 2. Regretting a wrong action
- 3. Confession before G-d and to another saying, "I have sinned and I deeply regret my actions"
- 4. Committing not to do that wrong doing again.

We reviewed the five languages of apologies by Gary Chapman as a modern way of looking at repentance, and enjoyed an in depth discussion about forgiveness and its complexities.

For dessert we tasted a variety of apples and honey treats.

### Books from the Shir Ami Library - Available for You!

We are introducing a new feature page in the Shir Ami Bulletin; reviews of books on the Shir Ami library shelves. This month this column spotlights two books; a children's book and a second book that can assist teachers and parents when discussing Bible stories with children.

My Name is Rachamim by Jonathan P. Kendall and illustrated by Alemu Eshtie tells the story of the airlift of Ethiopian Jews through the eyes of Rachamim, a young boy, and his family. The author provides a bit of the history of Jews in Ethiopia and of the famine that spurred Operation Moses, the airlift rescue of approximately 8000 Falasha Jews in 1984-85. The story is illustrated with pencil sketches by a young Ethiopian artist, Mr. Eshtie, who resides in Israel. Published in 1987, the author writes only of the events of the time in a manner suitable for 4 years old and up.

A good story has the power to delight, to teach, to captivate the mind and heart. The stories in *God's Garden: Children's Stories Grown from the Bible* by Adam Fisher do all this and more--they engross children and adults in the narrative of the Bible. Based on the midrashic tradition, these modern stories complement each weekly Torah portion--filling in details "missing" from our sacred text, elaborating on biblical figures, and highlighting Jewish values. The book provides the framework the story and a list of props to enable a storyteller to tell the Biblical stories. Background material, suggested values and discussion questions will make any story teller more comfortable in front of children.

These two books will reside on the window in the kitchen and are available to be borrowed. Shir Ami's library circulates books on an honor system, so feel free to borrow these or any other books from the library.
