President's Message

Shalom Shir Ami,

Now that a New Year has begun at Shir Ami, I would like to give you a preview of coming events and opportunities for deepening your involvement with the Congregation. Like September, October brings with it many holidays. Our Sukkot potluck and service on Friday, October 5th will be an evening of dining, prayer and reflection under the stars. This event is always fun, and a special one for me as it brings back memories of my family in our own Sukkah and the many meals we shared there. The following week, on Friday, October 12th, is Simchat Torah, a celebration that marks the conclusion of the annual cycle of reading the Torah with singing and dancing, and beginning that cycle anew. The Simchat Torah service will also be used to install and consecrate our newly elected Board of Directors, thereby giving you a great opportunity to get to know who is on the Board. October ends with a regular Shabbat service on Friday, October 26th, getting us back to our traditions while also starting new ones, the benefit of our participation in the Rabbinic Intern program.

November this year is all about the children of Shir Ami. Friday, November 9th features an early evening kids' Shabbat and an adult service later in the evening, with a festive potluck dinner to connect those participating in either. On November 30th, our Friday evening service will focus on the older children of our congregation (5th graders through B'nai Mitzvah age). We will also use this occasion to honor our new members. December has two noteworthy events: the first being our yearly Chanukah potluck, party and service on Friday, December 14th. The second will be a Chanukah Fundraiser, a new tradition for Shir Ami that will feature family-friendly activities and opportunities to obtain unique holiday gifts for family and friends. A date has not yet been set for this event, but if you're interested in helping

put it on, please let me know. (I'll continue this preview next month. In the meantime...)

Many of our year-round festivities involve the preparation and enjoyment of food, whether it's the first fruit of the harvest we enjoyed on Rosh Hashanah, the delicious Challot we have at our Friday evening onegs, or the golden latkes we savor on Chanukah. For many in our community, these delights are few and far between. To address this injustice and perform Tikkun Olam (repair of the world), Shir Ami uses the High Holidays as a time to collect food and money for these families in need. The collections we take in serve two worthy organizations: the South Hayward Parish's Food Pantry and Eden UCC's Comida para Cherryland (food for Cherryland). As of this writing, I don't yet know how much has been contributed from Shir Ami members, but to those who have, I thank you. And for the rest of vou... it's never too late! You can contribute anytime throughout the year to these groups. And while food is appreciated, your money will go farther than your groceries due to discounts these organizations can take advantage of. 


Books from the Shir Ami Library - Available for You!

This is the second month of a new feature page in the Shir Ami Bulletin; reviews of books on the Shir Ami library shelves. Again, we are spotlighting two books: a children's book and an illustrated book for adults.

Rafi's Search for the Torah Munching Monster, written and illustrated by Rabbi



Steven L. Mills, is a detective story for young children. Much like the TV show, *Blues Clues*, the central character finds clues that help to solve a mystery. The solution will help children to understand how a Torah is written or repaired. It is a great story for the upcoming holiday of Simchat Torah and could be read to pre-readers or read by an early reader.



Several years ago the Judah Magnes M useum in Berkeley, displayed a collection of embroidered panels that depicted a journey of survival during the Holocaust in Poland. *Memories of Survival* by Esther Nisenthal Krinitz and Bernice Steinhardt is the text

that accompanied the exhibit. Lavishly illustrated with beautiful photos of the panels, accompanied by text that fills in the story around each picture, this book will captivate the reader almost as much as the exhibition did.

These two books will be put on the window in the kitchen and are available to be borrowed. Shir Ami's library circulates books on an honor system, so feel free to borrow these or any other books from the library.


