#### President's Message for April 2013 Bulletin

Shalom Shir Ami,

As President, I'm honored and oftentimes humbled by how much time and effort our members freely give to this Congregation. Whether it's attending committee meetings, planning the Community Passover Seder or the Labor Day BBQ, buying some treats for a Shabbat oneg, or even just helping to rearrange tables and chairs at our events, I value each and every contribution made by our volunteers. On many occasions, I've felt the generous spirit that permeates our synagogue. On Friday, April 12<sup>th</sup>, it will be my turn to honor these contributions. I hope you'll join me that evening for a special "Honoring Volunteers" Shabbat service.

As for my volunteer time with the Congregation, I've been trying to find new resources for our Congregation, as well as new ways for Shir Ami to have an impact on our community. Every so often, I find information on both at once and I want to tell you about my recent find. The Jewish Federation and the Jewish Community Foundation of the East Bay recently sent out a request for proposals (RFP) to award grants in the broad theme of community impact for the East Bay Area. Specifically, this RFP outlines three priorities/funding areas they want proposals to address: Enriching Jewish Community Life & Culture, Strengthening Jewish Identity & Education, and Caring for Those in Need.



You're probably saying to yourself, "My goodness, those sound like areas Shir Ami already does!" If so, I heartily agree. I see these areas reflected in the very structure of Shir Ami, as well as the many activities we do every year. Our Religious and Membership Lifecycle Committees plan and execute events that enrich our Jewish life as well as the culture of our close-knit community. The many Adult Education events Shir Ami puts on (thanks to both our members and our Rabbinic Interns) have indeed strengthened our Jewish identity and brought new knowledge to our Congregation. Our Religious and Hebrew Sunday School has successfully done the same for our younger members, infusing education with the music that is the cultural legacy of Shir Ami. And as for caring for the needy, one has to look no further than our Social Action Committee, as well as our collaborations with the South Hayward Parish and Eden UCC.

Given our obvious expertise in these priority areas, I put the challenge to all of you: Is there some new program we could propose and lead for any of these funding themes? Is there a way to take the energy and creativity we already give to one another, as I've mentioned above, and use it to the benefit of the larger Eden Area community? Is there an existing Shir Ami program that could use

This past month we celebrated Passover, retelling the story of the Exodus, eating a festive meal, and gathering with family. The Exodus story for us as a people is not just a story, but also an integral piece in



the formation of our identities as Jews. We tell of the hardships the Israelites faced in the desert, conquered and oppressed by an overlord. We tell of a chosen man who successfully leads the people out of slavery and into freedom. Unfortunately, the exodus story is not our only story of oppression and hardships faced by the Jews there is a much more recent story. The Holocaust. On April 7<sup>th</sup>, Yom HaShoah, we remember the victims of the Holocaust, letting their memories be for us a blessing. On the 15th, we also remember Israeli's fallen soldiers and victims of terrorism on Yom HaZikaron. But just as there comes eventual freedom for the Israelites, we also commemorate our freedom by celebrating Yom HaAtzma'ut on the 16<sup>th</sup>, Israel's national independence day. The juxtaposition of these holidays next to one other is quite an emotional roller coaster, but represent the mixture of emotions felt by many who struggle with the pain of those lost in times of war for independence and the joy of freedom. So, let this month be for us a time to remember the more recent stories of Jewish struggles and times of sorrow, while also making time to celebrate the envisioned birthplace for every Jewish soul – Israel.

#### Oakland A's Jewish heritage Night, July 30




