Dear Shir Ami Community and Friends,

Did you know that we have a Religious Events Coordinator (REC) position on the board? The role of the REC is to find those people interested in coordinating a religious event such as the Tu BiSh'vat seder, Purim carnival, the community Passover seder, etc. Currently Shir Ami's REC is Jeremy Templeton.

Each religious event is documented so that volunteer event leaders can know all of the tasks that need to be done in order to have a successful (and less stressed) event. The agreement with the REC is that a leader needs to be identified or the event will not occur – in other words, Jeremy is not responsible for leading all events, simply for identifying leaders and assisting them as necessary.

Why am I writing about this now? One of our biggest religious events is coming up – the Community Passover Seder. For many years Barbara Heimowitz, Toni Schulberg and I have been leading this very successful event. We would like to invite some new people to work with us this year with the intention of handing over the reins and giving some new thought to the seder. We have documented everything about this event from the place settings on each table to how many pounds of potatoes we need. We even have a list of volunteers documented that love to help with set up, clean up, cooking food, etc.

This year's seder will be held on Saturday, April 23 at Oliver Hall, Eden United Church of Christ in Hayward. Rabbinic intern Julie Bressler will be leading the service. I truly have enjoyed leading this event and I think it is time to invite new people with new ideas to join in.

RABBINIC INTERNS' CLERGY COLUMN

Each month, our Rabbinic Interns take turns sharing their thoughts with us. This month's Rabbinic Interns' column is submitted by Student Rabbi Bryan Zive

Close your eyes, hear the tune and feel the beat. "Ce----lebrate good times, come on!" Ah yes, Kool & the Gang's hit song, "Celebration" is the perfect song to bring in Adar, the Hebrew month that we read from the *Megillah* and celebrate *Purim*. It's known as the month of celebration and happiness, so let's learn a little bit about the month that is designated to bring us joy!



Since we are in a leap year, Adar comes around two times! It occurs about once every three year, and we celebrate Purim during Adar II. The Talmud tells us that "when Adar arrives, we increase in joy" to welcome a season of miracles. Adar comes from the Hebrew root "Adir" which derives from strength and power. That word may be familiar to you, for on Passover, we sing "Adir Hu", God is Strong".

Why is it that we celebrate and party throughout Adar? *Megillat Esther* teaches us the story of the evil Haman (sound your groggers!!!) and the courage of Mordechai and Oueen Esther. But, did you know that Moses had something to do with the Purim story? Moses passed away during the month of Adar. The Talmud recalls Haman wishing to destroy our people and staged a lottery to determine the most opportune date. When the lot, or Pur, for which we get the holiday's name, fell on Adar, he rejoiced. But, what Haman did not know was that Moses passed away on the same day he was born, the 7th of Adar! The Talmud relates that his birth helped avert Haman's evil decree. Since we were able to be free, why not celebrate? And speaking of freedom, Adar was the final month the Israelites spent in Egypt before God redeemed them from slavery.

Adar's joy is so great, not only for the heroic and miraculous stories that we read in *Megillat Esther*, but because it serves the ideal opening to the ultimate rejoicing: the miracles of Passover, which comes about a month later. As we think ahead to our *Seders*, let us not overlook how fun and joyful *Purim* and Adar should be! Dress up, have a few beverages (adult or otherwise) and enjoy the month as it was meant to be celebrated...with endless happiness!

Sing it with me... "CE-----LEBRATE GOOD TIMES, COME ON!"
