FOOD BANK SERVICE DAY NOVEMBER 20

We will be making our annual pre-Thanksgiving trip to the Alameda County Community Food Bank on Sunday November 20. Our food sorting and packing session will run from 9:00 to 11:30. If anybody wants to car-pool meet me in the Shir Ami parking lot at 8:30. We should have room for 2-3 more in our car and more carpools can be arranged if a ride is needed.

Kids between the ages of 10 and 17 are welcome, but they need to have a waiver signed by a parent or guardian. You can download the waiver from the ACCFB volunteer page, or let Tom Spitzer know you need one and he'll get it to you. Adults can sign in and accept their responsibilities on-site.

The older children at the school are encouraged to attend.

For those of you new to this activity, and as a reminder for the veterans, please note that:

- Sturdy, closed (both toe and heel) shoes are required.
- Dressing in layers is recommended since the warehouse is not climate controlled.
- Please do not bring headphones, MP3 player or other personal music devices, and leave your bags and backpacks in your cars

RABBINIC INTERNS' CLERGY COLUMN

Shalom, Shir Ami,

During my November visit, we will be reading from Parshat Noach. This parsha not only contains the well-known story of Noah and the flood, but further, it contains the folkloric tale of the Tower of Babel. This story begins directly following the giant flood. At this point, all of humanity is united as one. Everybody speaks the same language, and together, everyone migrates eastward towards a land called Shinar. Once there, the people band together to build the giant Tower of Babel that they hope will reach heaven. They proclaim, "Come, let us build us a city, and a tower with its top in the sky, to make a name for ourselves; else we shall be scattered all over the world" (Genesis 11:4). God is troubled by humanity's endeavor. He finds it disrespectful and even threatening. God decides to confront the people, to mix up their speech, and to scatter humanity across the earth. From this point forward, humanity is plagued with different languages and an inability to understand those who are different.

While this tale is certainly far-fetched, I believe that it teaches an important lesson of which it is always

worth being reminded. Our tradition teaches that at the beginning of history, humanity was united. Too often, we allow differences—social, political, socioeconomic—to get in the way of our connections with others. We become afraid and closed off towards those who might challenge us or even disregard our thoughts. Yes, it may be uncomfortable to confront those who are different. Still, it is direly important. Connecting with difference forces us to confront our vulnerabilities, accept our oversights, and strengthen our senses of self. Connecting with difference forces us to either reify or rethink our beliefs.

Thus, I encourage our community to think of the Tower of Babel as we move into November. At one time, everyone was one. While it would be quixotic to say that humanity can one day unite completely again, it is critical for us to think about how we can respect others' differences in opinions, and ultimately, others' humanity.

I look forward to seeing everyone November 4th-6th to delve deeper into lessons such as this and more!



The Israel and World Jewry Committee Presents Holocaust survivor, Henry Oster Author of *The Kindness of the Hangman*

"Even In Hell, There Is Hope"



Wednesday, November 9, 2016 7pm - Sanctuary Temple Isaiah 945 Risa Road, Lafayette, CA 94549

As a young German boy Henry Oster survived deprivation in the Lodz Ghetto, a life-or-death selection in the Birkenau extermination camp, a firing squad in Auschwitz, being strafed by an Allied fighter, and starvation in Buchenwald. Henry rebuilt his life in America, arriving at 18 with no family, no English, no money and no education. Of 2,011 Jews uprooted from Cologne, Germany in 1941, he is the only survivor. He was still working as a world-respected Professor of Optometry on his 85th birthday, helping the world to see.
