President's Message

President's Message for May 2013 Bulletin

Shalom Shir Ami,

I cannot believe it's May already. Much has happened this year, and I'll be doing a minireview of our activities and accomplishments in next month's bulletin. This month, I'd like to acknowledge the contributions made to Shir Ami this year by our Rabbinic Interns, Allie Fischman and Aaron Sataloff. Among the many advantages of hosting Rabbinic Interns is that each year brings different perspectives on religious education and practice, as well as Jewish culture. Certainly this was the situation for both Aaron and Allie.

I know that many in the Congregation enjoyed the year long regimen of Trope Study led by Rabbi Allie, and I myself appreciated the Shirah (Music Night) she conducted back in mid-January. This evening was filled songs ranging from familiar favorites to newer tunes lifted from her camp and other experiences. I also fondly recall the service she led in our Sukkah, as it too was filled with song as well as peaceful reflection. Rabbi Allie led several Adult Education discussion sessions, the most memorable for me being the one on The Tanakh back in mid-February. I've always been a bit uncertain regarding the various books and other documents that detail Jewish history and prescribe Jewish life; Allie did a great job of explaining the differences between these sources. as well as the historical context of each.

Rabbi Aaron brought his own perspective and style to the services and activities he led throughout the year. Aaron helped us celebrate many of the year's festivals, with services on Chanukah, Tu B'Shvat, and Purim. In late March, Sara and I participated in his text study on Pesach. We very much enjoyed the exploration of social justice, societal economics, and cultural values that he led with this study. Rabbi Aaron also hosted many movie nights this year, including a

special outing to the Jewish Film Festival in Palo Alto.

Although it's not always easy to take on the training and guidance of Rabbinic students, whose experience prior to joining us can range from the novice-level to that of a seasoned professional, I'm proud that Shir Ami takes on this challenge. Many thanks are due to Diana Zankowsky and David Schulberg, our Religious Committee Co-Chairs, who mentor our student rabbis throughout the year. I'm both proud and thankful for the effort expended by Allie and Aaron in sharing themselves with us this year. I wish them both well in their continued education and hope that like many past Interns, they keep in touch with the Congregation and its members.

As we approach the summer, I would remind you that our summertime services are lay-led and rely on members of the Congregation to step up and take on the service-leading role. This does not need to be done alone; many of these services have 2 or 3 people collaborating on the structure and content of a given service. Plus, many within the Congregation have some talent in Torah chanting (newly acquired talent, in some instances) and who would be more than willing to show off this skill if asked. I would encourage those of you familiar with Shir Ami's Friday night service - and that's most of you - to consider helping to lead a summer service. Shir Ami Social Action Update for April - South Hayward Parish news

South Hayward Parish (SHP) held its first annual membership meeting in April. The main order of business was the election of new officers. The new president is Don Miller, pastor of New Bridges Presbyterian Church. Daryl Berman steps down from president to vice-president. Don gave an informative presentation on SHP programs (which Sara Lamnin was instrumental in preparing as manager of the Community Action Network). The need in the community is substantial, and the number of people that SHP touches is significant. SHP needs resources, both financial and human. The easiest way to make a financial donation is by visiting the SHP website. OR you can send a check to South Hayward Parish, 27287 Patrick Avenue, Hayward, CA 94544. Human resource contributions can take a number of forms. The SHP food pantry serves people four afternoons a week from 3:00 to about 5:00, and needs people to pick up sort, and help distribute food from area restaurants. Also, we are looking for people who can pick fruit from area fruit trees.

Other volunteer opportunities include tutoring students in the SHP sponsored GED program; general data entry as we try to improve our record keeping and data collection; and helping with client intake as we launch a new program to combat diabetes with better nutrition (funded with a Kaiser grant) later this spring. Insofar as Shir Ami is a member congregation of SHP, and all Shir Ami members are members of SHP; this gives us a great vehicle for contributing our financial or human resources to programs that have a direct benefit to the local community.


