President's Message for August, 2014

Dear Shir Ami Members and Friends,

I am privileged and honored to serve again as your President this year. I would like to thank Jon and the board of directors for the last two years for continuing Shir Ami's growth in membership, leadership, and communication.

This year, my two main areas of focus are our religious school and Shir Ami's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration.

#### Shir Ami School:

- At the end of this past school year, the Board created a school committee (consisting of the school liaisons to the board, Shir Ami parents of school-aged children, Shir Ami teachers and two members of the board). The committee, with Board approval, decided not to go to the outside for an Education Director for this coming year.
- At the annual members meeting on June 1, interested members participated in a high-level discussion led by Jane Steele and Rick Goldhoff about what they want the school to look like.
- Currently, Jane is the single point of contact for the religious school.
- Jane has scheduled meetings over the summer to iron out the details of school administration, curriculum, scheduling, etc.

## August 2014 Rabbinic Intern Message Reflections on Israel and Tisha B'Av

On August 5th we will celebrate our community's day of mourning, Tisha B'Av. This is a day of calamity for the Jewish people that most notably commemorates the destruction of the First and Second Temple in Jerusalem, which both happened in this season. However, this day has resonances far beyond the temples as the ninth of Av is said to be the day that the Golden Calf was erected, the day that the expulsion from Spain took effect, and the day of the liquidation of the Warsaw Ghetto. All of Jewish history is collapsed into one day, and our fast is symbolic of our mourning.

The Talmud teaches us something important about what the rabbis attributed our exile to. When asked why we lost the First Temple, the Talmud answers that it was taken from us because of idolatry. adultery, and violence. However, all of these practices were eradicated by the time of the Second Temple, so why did we lose that Temple too? The Talmud continues by saying that sinat chinam, baseless hatred, earned us our second exile. This text teaches us something important: equal to violence, idolatry, and sexual licentiousness is senseless hatred.

The events in Israel in the past several weeks have caused all of us tremendous pain and heartache for our homeland. Both sides have suffered greatly from rockets fired, property destroyed, and lives lost. This is not a good time for Israel. However, I can't help but note that this violence is happening during our season of lament that surrounds the ninth of Av. Many Jews believe that the modern Jewish state of Israel is our Third Temple. We have regained sovereignty in the land of our ancestors. And yet, many Jews have not learned the lesson of Tisha B'Av —senseless hatred abounds in the Jewish state.

I am not making an argument of moral equivalency between the Jewish army and the terrorist organization Hamas. As Prime Minister Netanyahu put it: We use our weapons to protect our bodies; they use their bodies to protect their weapons. The firing of rockets from Gaza into Israel is morally repugnant and does tremendous damage to their own people and livelihood. That being said, Israel and her people do not have clean hands in this matter either.

Government officials in Israel have fanned the flames of hatred in their own people by saying blatantly racist things about Palestinians and using ethnic slurs about Arabs. Right Wing Israeli rapper Yoav Eliasi decried against the IDF and the Israeli left for shutting down the blatantly Fascist organization Kahane Hai that encourages anti-Arab violence in the name of Israeli nationalism. Jeremy Leigh, professor at HUC in Israel, reported that taking a cursory look at his daughter's Facebook page revealed many thousands of Israelis "liking" statuses such as "Violence against Arabs is not a crime but a value" and "Shoah (Holocaust) for the Arabs." The group Tag M'Chir (Price Tag), a group of fundamentalist religious right-wingers, regularly desecrates Mosques and Arab residences and business, sending the message that they are not welcome, even though they are citizens of Israel.

This racism and hatred is an embarrassment to the entirety of the lewish people. I hope that we will educate ourselves and our communities in ways that are both honest to what is happening on the ground in Israel and helpful for the peace process. I hope that we will have the wisdom to love our homeland while being appropriately critical of the aspects of it that are destructive to peace and to our people. And I hope that we will all cultivate in ourselves the openheartedness for both Israelis and Palestinians who are suffering so much in this horrible conflict. Baseless hatred according to the rabbis destroyed the Second Temple. I hope that the flames of hatred burning on both sides be doused out in our Third Temple.
