# President's Message

#### Guest Column from Jon Zimmerman, August 2015

Shalom Shir Ami Community,

As Shir Ami's Treasurer-Payables, I thought I'd give President Harriet a summertime respite and use this month's *President's Message* to answer a recurring question: "Where do all our dues payments and donations go?"

First, it's important to know how and from whom we get our income. For the total income collected last year (June 2014 through July 2015), about 64% came from membership dues and other fees Shir Ami collects (e.g. building fund, school tuition), 22% from event income including our High Holy Days, and 13% from donations that include Yarzheit donations. It's worth noting that a significant portion of these contributions came from outside of Shir Ami's membership, including past members, family of deceased members, and friends of the congregation. The remaining 1% of our income came from commercial sources, including bank account interest and donations through our participation in the eScrip and Amazon Smile programs. If you haven't already, please enroll in the eScrip program (<a href="http://www.escrip.com">http://www.escrip.com</a>) so that your purchases at Safeway and elsewhere can benefit Shir Ami. Also, don't forget to do your Amazon shopping at http://smile.amazon.com and specify Congregation Shir Ami as your charity of choice.

It should come as little surprise that our largest set of expenses were our Religious activities (39%), which included costs of hosting our Rabbinic Interns from the Hebrew Union College. These costs covered not only a fee to the College itself, but also lodging and travel expenses incurred during the Interns' visits. Our Hebrew & Religious School made up 19% of our expenses, 12% for Repair & Maintenance (including building cleaning and grounds upkeep), 12% for Event Expenses, 7% for Operations, 6% for Utilities (e.g.

water, gas, electric), and the remaining 5% for miscellanea, such as insurance, advertising, and our membership in the Castro Valley Chamber of Commerce. It's interesting to note that our membership in the Union for Reform Judaism is only about 5% of our expenses, roughly costing us about \$80 per member unit.

This accounting of our income and expenses reveals a lot about Shir Ami. Our expenses show that Religion and Education remain our congregation's top priorities. The latter priority was evident by the increased participation in our School last year, both on the student side and by their parents and caregivers too. Our income shows that the whole congregation supports these priorities (not just those who partake of these services), and that we're sustained by the generosity of many members who go above and beyond their dues commitments.

Finally, I wanted to point out that the information

above does not include the many "in-kind" expenses that are routinely donated by Shir Ami members. For 2014-15, this contribution totaled almost \$4,000, and served to lessen our expenses to a significant degree. This generosity of both materials and time shows how this community continues to support one another and makes our congregation thrive.

## Preparing for the High Holy Days, 6-week class begins Wed. Aug. 5, 3 pm

The Jewish month of Elul, which precedes the High Holy Days, is traditionally a time of renewal and reflection. It offers a chance for spiritual preparation for the Days of Awe. We look to begin the year with a clean slate, starting anew, refreshed.

## Message from Julie Bressler

By the time of this bulletin's printing, I will be about to enter my 10<sup>th</sup> Shabbat at URJ Camp Newman this summer. For the past nine weeks, I have spent my days organizing educational programming, Israeli dancing, chatting with campers, leading tefillah, mentoring staff members and so much more. It feels like I have been here forever and that the time has passed by in a minute all at once. I may be exhausted and in need of some non-camp food, but through it all, I can say without hesitation that I am having the best time.

As a young child, camp gave me the opportunity to breathe Judaism into my daily activities. As we prayed before and after every meal and Israeli danced on Friday nights, I learned how to live on Jewish time. However, the Camp Newman mission statement, to inspire a love of Judaism, does not only impact our campers in these obviously Jewish moments. The campers' and staff members' love of Judaism grows as their cabin creates a *brit*, or covenant, on the first night of camp; their Israeli counselor brings her favorite chocolate from home and talks about what it was like to be in the IDF; they sing their hearts out during session songs and play together in the pool.

Camp plays an incredibly important role in the lives of children, like the young people of Shir Ami and myself, who grow up in a region where the Jewish population is small. At camp, I finally was not Julie the Jewish girl, but Julie – the camper who loved gaga, Israeli dance, sharing secrets with my cabin-mates and making friendship bracelets. Judaism united us all and my counselors served as role models and big sisters and brothers who made each day joyous and exciting. We celebrate Shabbat with 700 of our peers and have the opportunity to build deep friendships that can last a lifetime. I love reading the comments of campers as they reflect on their experiences. While there are always many comments about how much they loved climbing the tower and playing sports, the common theme of "I am my best self at camp" rings loud and clear.

As I have the opportunity to engage with camp from a new perspective, I am also looking forward to entering this second year as a student rabbi with Congregation Shir Ami. I have loved getting to know all of you over this past year and praying and learning together.
